Premier Ghiz Recognizes Employees for Promoting Diversity in the Workplace

CHARLOTTETOWN, PEI -- Provincial government employees are making meaningful contributions to the provincial public service through their concerted and successful efforts to increase diversity in their workplaces, says Premier Robert Ghiz.

The third award was presented to the Human Resource Team, Department of Community Services, Seniors and Labour for organizational leadership in diversity strategic planning.
